

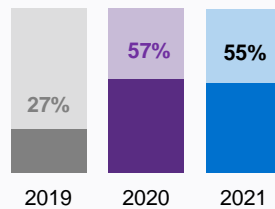
INTRODUCTION

The Medical Training Survey (MTS) is a national, profession-wide survey of doctors in training in Australia. It is safe and confidential and generates profession-wide data that can be used to strengthen medical training in Australia. The MTS is conducted annually with doctors in training, with 2021 representing the third wave of data collection.

METHOD

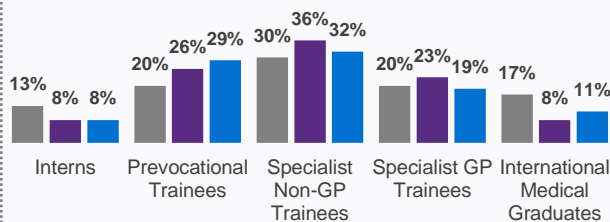
In 2021, n=21,604 doctors in training responded to the online survey, with n=20,671 responses eligible for analysis (i.e. currently training in Australia) between 22 July and 8 October 2021.

RESPONSE RATES



These results have been based on n = 390 doctors in training, working in locations across NT and compared against 2019 (n = 218) and 2020 (n = 400) results where available.

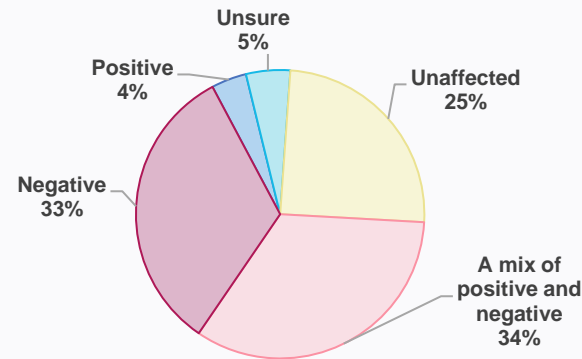

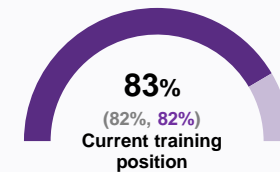

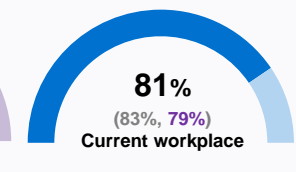

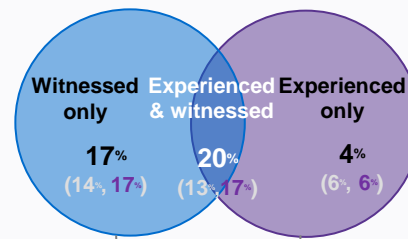
% would recommend current training position to other doctors

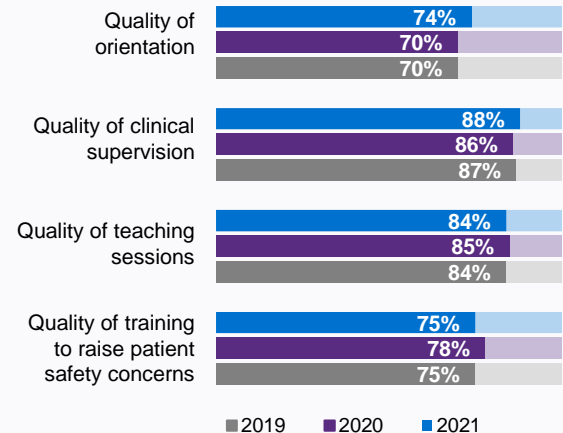
